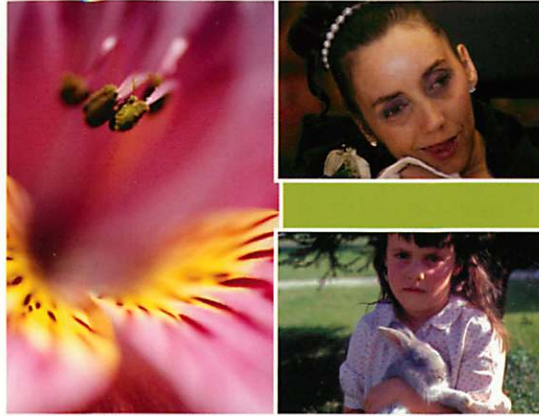

At the age of 14 Renee was in a car hit by a drunk driver. Renee suffered a brain-stem injury that left her completely disabled. She never spoke another word after the accident and was dependent on others for her care and needs.

On July 31, 2009 she was put to bed and 20 minutes later she woke up in the arms of the Lord. Today she is speaking a mile a minute, walking, and dancing before God's throne.

Friends of the Myers' family have established a scholarship in memory of Renee Myers. Renee was the youngest daughter of Dan and Dorene Myers, both Alumni of Vanguard University.

Each year students who demonstrate need and meet the requirements of the University's Alumni Scholarship Committee will be assisted in their pursuit of academic excellence as they pursue their career goals.

Renee's memorial service was private, consequently there was not an opportunity to invite friends to support such a scholarship that will assist students who demonstrate need.

When Renee died she gave the gift of life to more than seventy-five people. The irony of Renee's life is that for the last thirty years her body was unable to serve her in any meaningful way, yet in death she was able to make it possible for others to live.
